



Focus On Life has been a GLORIOUS initiative of the Christian Advocacy Society (Protestant), Archdiocese of Vancouver (Catholic), and Signal Hill (non-sectarian).

With a *huuuge* lump in our throats, we are bringing to close our womencentered media consortium. No conflicts! No issues! Our partner Signal Hill has decided, strategically, to move forward as a unique education-focused charity.



Way too many creative committee members, past and present, to acknowledge. But we do wish to recognize the five original visionaries: Peter Ryan, Monica & Malcolm Roddis, Anthony Longoz, and Brian Norton.

Our first Gala fundraiser was held in 1999 – for 1,600 attendees! – featuring speaker Norma McCorvey ("Roe" in the historic Roe v. Wade). And the rest is history.

Our two decades of FOL collaborations have included TV commercials, social media clips, educational videos, and more. Our life-affirming media projects have been viewed (with no hyperbole) by millions.

For examples, "Your Pregnancy & Informed Consent" has had thousands of USBs distributed and over 44,600 online viewings. The video featuring conjoined twins Tatiana and Krista is currently at 292,700 views. The video featuring abortion survivor Melissa Ohden has 1.7 million views.

God only knows the full impact of all these media collaborations – all generously funded by the kind dinner guests at our annual Galas.

What we do know: Babies at risk for abortion are alive today – now as children, teenagers, and young adults. Women with unexpected pregnancies have been given compassionate care and resources. Women and men seeking healing for post abortion grief have been helped. And youth have been mentored on healthy sexuality, self-worth, and the intrinsic value of all human life. WE ARE GRATEFUL.

### The Other Side by Sara Chang

It was the eve of a new decade. 2009. I was at Missions Fest, an annual missions conference, sitting in a talk with hundreds of others when I felt a sudden nudge within. *The crisis pregnancy centre! I wonder if they have a booth in the exhibition hall.* I quickly scrambled through the pages of the pamphlet I received. There it was!

Two months earlier, I had not known of crisis pregnancy centres. But God stirred in my heart and on my family Christmas trip in California, He led us to drive past one. Curious, I looked them up online and discovered the work they did. It aligned with my heart. I had been praying for a place like this.

This was the first step in a decade-long journey with this ministry, and Missions Fest was the last piece of the puzzle. I sought out our booth in the midst of hundreds. It is a misty memory now as I wrote down my name. I never knew how my life would change thereafter.

I have seen the beauty and flourishing of our ministry, and been a grateful witness to stories of lives changed for good. It is surreal to be standing on the other side of the booth now, connecting with others like myself.

At the dawn of a new decade, the harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. There is still much to be done, many women, men, children, and babies who need our love and help. But our volunteers are few... Will you kindly think about serving here?

Every helping hand sows into eternity, and rewrites the narrative by God's grace. *You could be the one.* 

### **COVID-19 Update**

It's not what any of us expected. Many things changed in a short period of time.

We deeply care about the people of Greater Vancouver. We believe our services are essential and therefore have made adaptations to reduce the possibility of COVID-19 spread.

Our decision to keep crisis outreach support and information available is with the understanding that COVID-19 can add to the stress that someone may already be experiencing because of an unexpected pregnancy, post abortion stress, sexual assault, domestic abuse or material needs.

For this reason, our services are being offered to those in distress via telephone, online peer counselling, and video conferencing. We are temporarily not seeing drop-ins. Also, we won't be accepting material donations at this time.
